To all our families,

Thank you to everyone who came to the reception Read Write Inc session this week. In the session you were able to watch a live lesson and then have a debrief on:

- Understanding reading development.
- An Introduction to the way we teach phonics, reading and writing in school.
- Discuss the reading system and home learning.
- Share strategies to support you at home with your child's reading development.

Year 2 have been learning all about how we need to stay healthy and how eating healthy food helps us to do this along with taking regular exercise. This week we looked at our lunchboxes. We tried some different foods and categorised them into their food groups. We looked at proteins, carbohydrates, fruits, and vegetables.

Next week we will design and create a healthy sandwich, choosing foods from the different food groups. We would like to invite you in at the end of the day (2.45pm) to share the children's sandwiches and help the children to evaluate them.

## Curriculum vison at Caister Infant with Nursery School

Our curriculum helps to maintain high expectations and broaden the possibilities and opportunities our children experience. High quality texts, both stories and nonfiction, will be the main driver for the topics and our curriculum. Our children will acquire good vocabulary through a love for books which will enable them to express themselves confidently. The focus on the basic skills of speaking and listening, reading, writing and mathematics will help pupils to acquire secure building blocks, which will equip them with essential skills to navigate their future.





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We are delighted to announce that after half-term, we will be offering an after-school football club run by The Community Sports Foundation in partnership with Norwich Football Club. This will only be available to Year 1 and Year 2 children.



A CSF football extra-curricular club will use the power of Norwich City Football Club to engage each participant through each session.

Children will learn techniques through a series of skill development drills and fun games that challenge their learning. Each session will finish with a match to allow the pupils to perform what they have learned.



The sessions will be on Thursdays from 3.15-4.15 and will start on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November. To make it fair and for as many children as possible to have access to this club, we will have sessions in half term blocks.

The first block will be targeted at girls' football. This will run every Thursday from 2<sup>nd</sup> November to 14<sup>th</sup> December.

The second session will be boys' football and will run every Thursday, from 4<sup>th</sup> January -15<sup>th</sup> February. (A form for registration will be sent out next term)






Please donate any plastic bottles or milk cartons to your class teacher. We are filling up the tyres on the playground before adding compost.

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
