At Caister we believe in continuing Tapestry into Key Stage 1, learning opportunities will still be shared, supporting your understanding of how children learn in school. They will look different to those that you have seen before and be less frequent. Please continue to share their experiences at home as the children are always so proud to talk about these. 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Free school meals and other support for pupils - here's what you need to know:

Caister Primary Federation is an inclusive Federation, and we work hard to support all children no matter their background. We know that some children are however more vulnerable than others or some may need greater support to help them be successful in school.

We have additional support for children from disadvantaged backgrounds. This includes providing free school meals, special support during school holidays and providing extra funding to schools to support pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds and improve education outcomes. Here's everything you need to know about the support we offer and how to access it.

Which children get free school meals and how do they access them?

We've significantly expanded access to free school meals in recent years. You can check your eligibility for free school meals below.

Not only does this entitle your child to free school meals, but you





will also receive up to £240 per child, per year in supermarket vouchers to help with the rise in the cost of living. These vouchers will be paid up to and including March 2024, so it is important to check your eligibility as soon as possible.

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
