Last week we had some mad scientists come in to visit. We learned about Daniel Bernoulli and Isaac Newton, and found out how we could use the air around us to make something defy gravity and fly!


In the afternoon we continued learning about Sir Isaac Newton and how he discovered that white light from the sun is made up of the seven colours of the rainbow! We used a prism and some special refracting glasses to help us see the rainbows being formed when light is bent.

We then did some learning about electricity. We lit a light bulb using a plasma ball! We even used the electricity in the plasma ball to 'burn our bogies!





We also had a visit from local real scientists. Three psychologists from the University of East Anglia came to talk to us about our brains and how they work! We found out what neurons are and that there are as many neurons in our brain as there are stars in the sky! We then used pipe cleaners to make one. We looked at the different lobes of our brain and what the different parts control. We discovered that our brain is amazing! We then had a look at some optical illusions to show how our brains can work in different ways and sometimes trick us! We then made our own optical illusions. A very inspiring session finding out about a new kind of Science!




