Our Nurture sessions are tailored to the individual child's interests and needs. Including self-esteem, anger management, anxiety and bereavement.

We have time to chat whilst participating in Art activities, Lego, Colouring, games, stories, etc. We also have weekly visits from our Therapy dog 'Molly'.

Our Nurture sessions are a great opportunity for the child to be listened to and discuss any worries and concerns they have in a safe, cosy and welcoming environment.

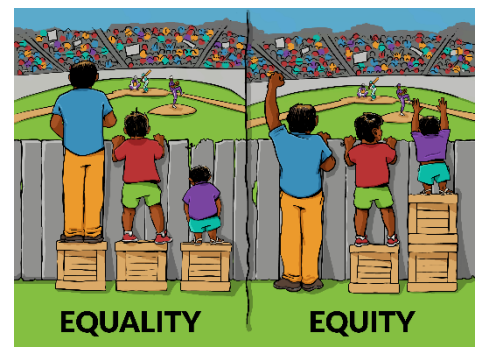

SEND Spotlight

At Rollesby Primary School, we work very hard to make sure our children and young people with SEND are given the opportunities, support and provision that they require to ensure that their special educational needs are met.

Children with SEND may need extra support with communication and interaction needs including social interaction skills and transitions, SEMH (Social, Emotional and Mental Health) needs which include anxiety, emotional regulation and attention and concentration difficulties. Some of our children may require support for learning and cognition needs including any literacy barriers they may have such as dyslexia, or difficulties with Maths and working memory needs. Children may also have sensory and physical needs which are conditions that affect a person's ability to perceive and interact with the environment. Some children may have needs across the four main areas of need.

We are committed to ensuring that all our children receive the support that they need in order to flourish in every aspect of school life.

There are lots of things that we do to make sure that are children with SEND are supported and included in all aspects of school life. A few of these things include:

- Daily sensory circuits tailored to children's sensory and physical needs.
- Visual timetables and visual support used across the whole school to support communication and interaction needs including Now/Next boards.
- Emotional regulation support using Zones of Regulation
- In every classroom, children have a calm corner to support emotional needs.
- Use of social stories to support understanding of new situations and unfamiliar environments including support for new transition and events outside school.
- Sports events and opportunities for all children including those that support turn taking and social interaction.
