



We use maths and English skills in almost every aspect of our daily lives and we all need to use them well to reach our goals.

On the Functional Skills courses you will develop your skills, build confidence and get qualifications that can boost your CV, improve your chances of finding work and help you to study on vocational courses.

Class based – attend two sessions per week, in a suitable venue, for around ten weeks to achieve and move onto the next level.

Fast-Track – This is a seven week programme. You will work online with support from a dedicated tutor.

Pure Online – These courses take place completely online. Sessions are often twice weekly but are always flexible to fit in with your lifestyle.
