Dear families,

Thank you for coming along to parents evening – it was really lovely to see so many parents. If you didn't make it, please contact the school office to arrange for you to see your child's class teacher or a telephone call. We like to see as many parents as we can to let you know how your child is getting on.

<u>Parent/Carer Questionnaire</u> – If you haven't already, please fill in our parents' questionnaire. We really want to do the very best we can for all our children and your feedback is very useful!

Thank you for the feedback we received so far, parents/carers have highlighted they would like to know more about how their children are doing. We have two parent evenings a year and we share a written report at the end of the year along with informal invites to 'sit and see' sessions half termly to look at your child's learning. Should you want to know more about how your child is doing at any point throughout the year, please contact the school office who will be happy to arrange a meeting or telephone call with your child's teacher.

We know that some of you have asked about clubs, particularly for lower school, and we will be looking at how we can increase our offer.

How you can help at home...

Reading

We are working hard to promote a love of reading in school and the children read at various points of the school day. Our expectation of home reading is that the children read at least 3 times per week and record in their reading diary. You can also talk with your child about what they are reading and who the author is.

Spelling

We have introduced a new spelling scheme to align with our phonics teaching – Read, Write Inc Spelling. Each week your child will bring home a set of spellings which focus on the spelling pattern they have



been learning. These will be recorded in their personal spelling log and children are expected to bring this into school each day. At home, please encourage the children to practise the spellings and talk about the meaning of each word.

TT Rockstars

TT Rockstars is a great way for all children to get stuck into a challenge! We ask that children access TTRockstars activities online each week to support them in learning their times tables with increasing speed. *We will write to you again with more information about homework in the coming weeks.*





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Celebrations

Year 6

Maths	We have learned how to multiply fractions by integers and by other fractions.
English	We have continued to learn about endangered species and write information texts about them using formal language.
Science	We investigated whether a lower resting heart rate affected one's sprint speed. Children carried this out on the playground before recording their results on a scatter graph.
Art	We compared two pieces of artwork by trailblazing artists and then children gave their opinion on each of them.
Computing	Pupils learned how to code broadcast and receive messages on Scratch.
Geography	In Geography, Year 6 have explored different ways of measuring distance on an ordnance survey map, including using: rulers, gridlines, string and fingers.
RE	Y6 tried traditional foods that are eaten on the Jewish celebration of Rosh Hashanah.
PE	In PE, 6B learned what their bodies were able to do during Fitness lessons. 6T and 6W learned the fundamentals of basketball and hockey.





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Acorns

We have been learning about Remembrance Day and creating our own display. The children have learnt about the four different poppy colours, red, purple, white and black and what they represent. We have also talked about

rationing and what foods were available and have made a war time recipe of bread pudding. This recipe was used if there were any leftovers to enable the children to have



a treat occasionally during the war.



We have been focusing on good manners, turn taking, being kind and ready to learn this week. The children have been having great fun trying to find out who the secret pupil certificate is being given to daily.

ELSA session this week and for the following weeks has a focus on anxiety

and this helps the children understand that anxiety is an everyday emotion, but it is how we manage anxiety that makes the difference to our own wellbeing.



Building

block therapy sessions have allowed some of the children the opportunity to create fantastic rooms using their social skills such as turn taking, listening, supporting each other, and taking on other's views and ideas.



Reading is part of our daily routine in school and we encourage you to hear your child read daily even if it's only for 5/10 minutes each day.
