Arriving and leaving school

Thanks to those families who have already worked on saying goodbye to their child at the gate or picked them up from the gate at the end of the day, in preparation for the 22nd January (please see video here).

We are writing to all children's families to emphasise the importance of being in school on time as there have been numerous incidents of some families routinely arriving at school at 9.00 a.m. or later and collecting their children at 3.20 p.m. or later.

School starts at 8.40 a.m. every day. Children need to be in their classrooms by 8.45 a.m. and no later so that they can start their lessons promptly. Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. This means that they are often unsettled and confused about tasks and have not had the opportunity to be greeted by their teachers at the classroom door.
