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Social media and device monitoring


We regularly teach the children about E-Safety, including the use of social media through our PSHE, Computing and assembly curriculum. However, as a school, the children's use of social media platforms is impossible for us to monitor and is the responsibility of parent/carers who provide the devices to their children.

It is vital that, as a parent/carer, you closely monitor what your child is accessing and take account of the pressures and challenges that can be placed on your children before you allow access to social media platforms. Many of these platforms have age restrictions of 13+ or more for very good reason.

If you are genuinely concerned, **take control**:

- Do not allow your child to have access to apps that are agerestricted (they are restricted for good reason).
- 2. Block/remove contacts other than those <u>you</u> approve.
- Set limited times for use of the phone and /or access to a device and only when you are present.
- 4. Do not allow your child to go to bed with their phone.
- 5. Report offensive content to the police.

If all else fails and you are still concerned, **remove the device**. Your child's wellbeing is much more important than a phone.
